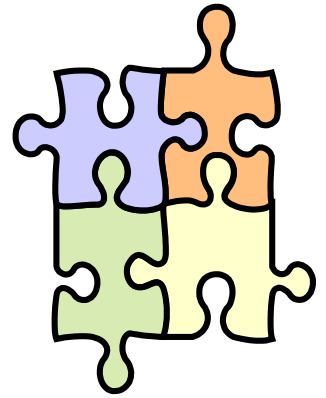


February Book Report

After you have independently read a book on your level, you will create a puzzle as your book report:

1. Use **8 ½ x 11 cardstock or paper** to create a 9-piece puzzle. Number your pieces 1–9. You *do not* need to cut them apart unless you would like to.
2. On piece #1 should be a creative display of the title and author of the book as well as your name.
3. Piece #2 should list the main character and other important characters in your book as well as include a picture of the main character.
4. Piece #3 should tell the reader about the setting of the book and include a picture.
5. Piece #4 should tell the reader the problem of the book.
6. Piece #5 should tell the reader one of the main events of the book.
7. Piece #6 should tell the reader another of the main events of the book.
8. Piece #7 should tell the reader about the climax of the book. (Remember, the climax is the part of the story where everything is the most messed up. It is the turning point of the story.)
9. Piece #8 should give a hint of the solution of the problem but not give away the ending.
10. Piece #9 should be your personal rating of the book.
11. Mount your puzzle on a piece of construction paper.
12. Decorate the edges of the construction paper in the theme of your book. (In other words, give it a border on the construction paper.)
13. Outline your illustrations in black sharpie or pen to make them “pop.”
