
At the end of the novel, there are many questions left unanswered. Make your own predictions. (Do NOT just write "yes" or "no." Explain your answers.)

#### SHARECROPPERS' CYCLE OF POVERTY

By the time sharecroppers had shared their crops and paid their debts, they rarely had any money left. A sharecropper became tied to one plantation, having to work until his debts were paid.



TJ's Family	Cassie's Family
TJ's family (like most of the other black families in Roll of Thunder) does NOT own the land they farm. So, they have to give half of their crop to Mr. Granger.	Cassie's family owns their own land. They don't have to give up half of their crop to a landowner.
They shop at the Wallace store. The Wallaces have an arrangement with the Grangers so that the debts can be paid off later for the food and supplies the families need. That just means that TJ's family owes Mr. Granger even more.	Because the Logans don't owe the Grangers or the Wallaces any money, they are free to shop where they want.
